However, if you are unable to open it the general rule to teach the children is mostly we add 's' to make words plural but if the words end with one of the following sounds then add 'es' sh, ch, ss, s, x, z/zz.</p> <p>Some words you may want to start with are:                      Cat, dog, fox, dish, frog, ear, friends, six, wax.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>English</b></p> <p>Thinking about the keyworkers at the current time - can you create your own keyworker superhero. What is their outfit like? Draw a picture of them. Write a few sentences about why they are a superhero, what they do and what their powers are.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>English</b></p> <p>Write a poem about your superhero from yesterday - it could be an acrostic poem, where each line starts with a letter that spell out a word - e.g. doctor, it could be a poem on a theme - their job / powers / what they do. It can take whatever form you like - remember poems don't have to rhyme but they can if you'd like them to.</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Comparing length</b></p> <p>Using objects around your home / outside can you compare the length of your items? Try to use the words longer / shorter / longest / shortest. Can you sort all, or some of, your objects into order from shortest to longest?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Comparing weight</b></p> <p>Using objects around your home / outside can you compare the length of your items? Try to use the words heavier / lighter / heaviest / lightest. Can you sort all, or some of, your objects into order from shortest to longest?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Introducing capacity and volume</b></p> <p>Consider the words empty / full then almost empty / almost full. Use cups and complete this practically. Can you find the full / empty / almost full / almost empty cup? Using two cups - can you compare the amount in each one? Which has more / less in? You can introduce more cups if you feel confident with this activity. I have also attached a worksheet for you if you'd prefer to use this.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Measuring capacity</b></p> <p>Using a measuring jug, or similar, how many cups of water does it need to be full? Can you work out how many cups would be needed to fill 2 jugs / 3 jugs? To follow on from this you can see how many jugs it would take to fill a bucket, or similar. Can you work out how many cups you would need to fill one bucket?
